Summary: "When I first introduced Teams, I was really trying to get my students to communicate with each other more frequently and to get a better interaction between them and their tutors and demonstrators", says Dr. David Kellermann, engineering faculty member at the University of New South Wales. In just three short weeks of introducing Teams, class posts were up 900% of what it had been the previous year.
